- You can now quickly access the **ACMG ACT sheets and Confirmatory Algorithms** by clicking the ACT Sheet button on the homepage of the ACMG website www.acmg.net? The ACMG ACT Sheets are a very useful tool for Newborn Screening and were developed to help guide physicians through the process of confirming the diagnosis in a baby who has a positive Newborn Screening (NBS) test result.
