

Centrifugal mill

The Type ZM 1000 Ultra Centrifugal Mill, new from Retsch (Haan, Germany), not only sprints to 15,000 rpm in three seconds, but also reduces grindables down to analyzing sample fineness during the process. High rotor speed rates combined with large, active, ring sieve surfaces reduce retention times in the grinding chamber, and reduce thermal stressing.


