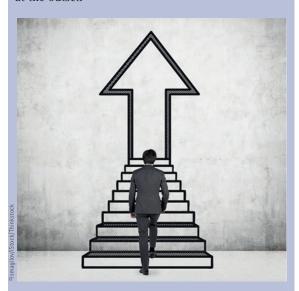

WHAT NOW FOR BUY-TO-LET PROPERTY OWNERS?

It seems right now that everything is against buy-to-let property investors. The Bank of England have plans to tighten their ship with buy-to-let mortgage lending, as there are fears, and evidence, that the sudden surge in recent years is causing an in-balance in the property market.

There is also the change in tax legislation for landlords claiming tax relief on mortgage interest. The system that will be phased-in from 2017 to 2020 will see, eventually, only basic rate tax being claimed against rental income.

This will affect thousands of property owners, many who already are making plans to increase rent, move properties into a company structure, where they will be protected, sell properties, or pay off loans.
