This correction does not affect the conclusions of the Article. The authors apologize for the error and any inconvenience caused by it.




Figure 2. Nicotine effect on AMPA current and AMPA/NMDA ratio are dependent on α 7-nAChR and intracellular calcium but not NMDA receptor. (A) Representative traces of AMPA and NMDA currents before (ctl) and after (nic) nicotine in slices preincubated with DH β E (1 μ M, top) or MLA (10 nM, bottom); (B) Bar plot summary of nicotine effect on AMPA/NMDA ratio in DH β E, MLA and control (ctl). **P < 0.001 (nicotine vs. control, paired Student's t-test, n = 6). (C) Representative traces of AMPA and NMDA currents before (ctl) and after (nic) nicotine treatment with intracellular infusion of BAPTA (10 mM) are shown on the top; histograms and bar plots of AMPA/NMDA ratio are shown on the bottom (P > 0.05, paired Student's t-test, n = 5). (D) Representative traces (top) and histograms and dot plots (bottom) of AMPA currents before (ctl), after APV (apv, 50 μ M) and APV with nicotine (apv + nic). P = 0.368, apv vs. control; *P = 0.009, apv vs. nic + apv; P = 0.013, ctl vs. nic + apv (paired Student's t-test, n = 6).

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
