The aim of the Research Summit is to empower the next generation of dental students, encourage connections within the dental community and showcase the academic endeavours of dental students. ## Research submissions

This year, we aim to make the summit just as enjoyable and informative with exclusive sponsors, an opportunity for the winner to present their research at the BDSA Conference and to be published in *BDJ Student*. Furthermore, BDSA Academic Officer Aman Aziz has arranged for the winner to be able to choose a prize from an exclusive prize pool. All participants will have their research published in the BDSA Book of Abstracts and will receive a BDSA accredited Certificate of Participation.

Submissions will be judged by academics and professors from the University of Leeds who will select the top 5 abstract submissions. The deadline for all submissions is Monday 13 January 2025 by 5pm and the winning student will be informed on Thursday 30 January.

## Criteria/submission guidelines

The criteria for participating dental students is as follows:

- All UK undergraduate dental students are eligible for submission (including non-BDSA members)
- Open to all dental research
- Previous submissions are accepted
- All submissions should be in abstract form, original and not have been published elsewhere.
- All abstract submissions must be in PDF format and present in the following format:
  - ◆ Title
  - ◆ Background
  - ◆ Methods
  - ◆ Results
  - ◆ Conclusion.

The word limit should not exceed 500 words.
