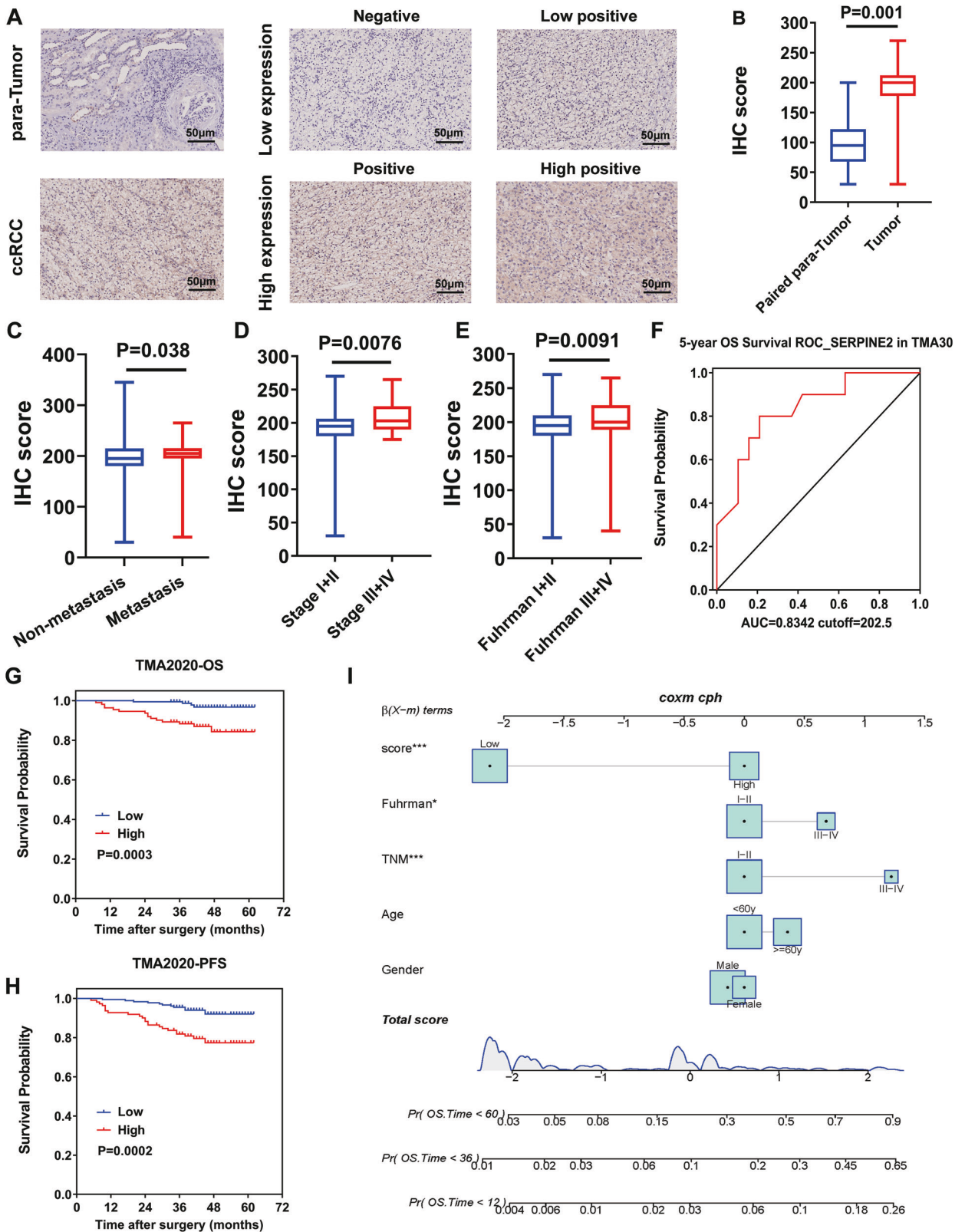

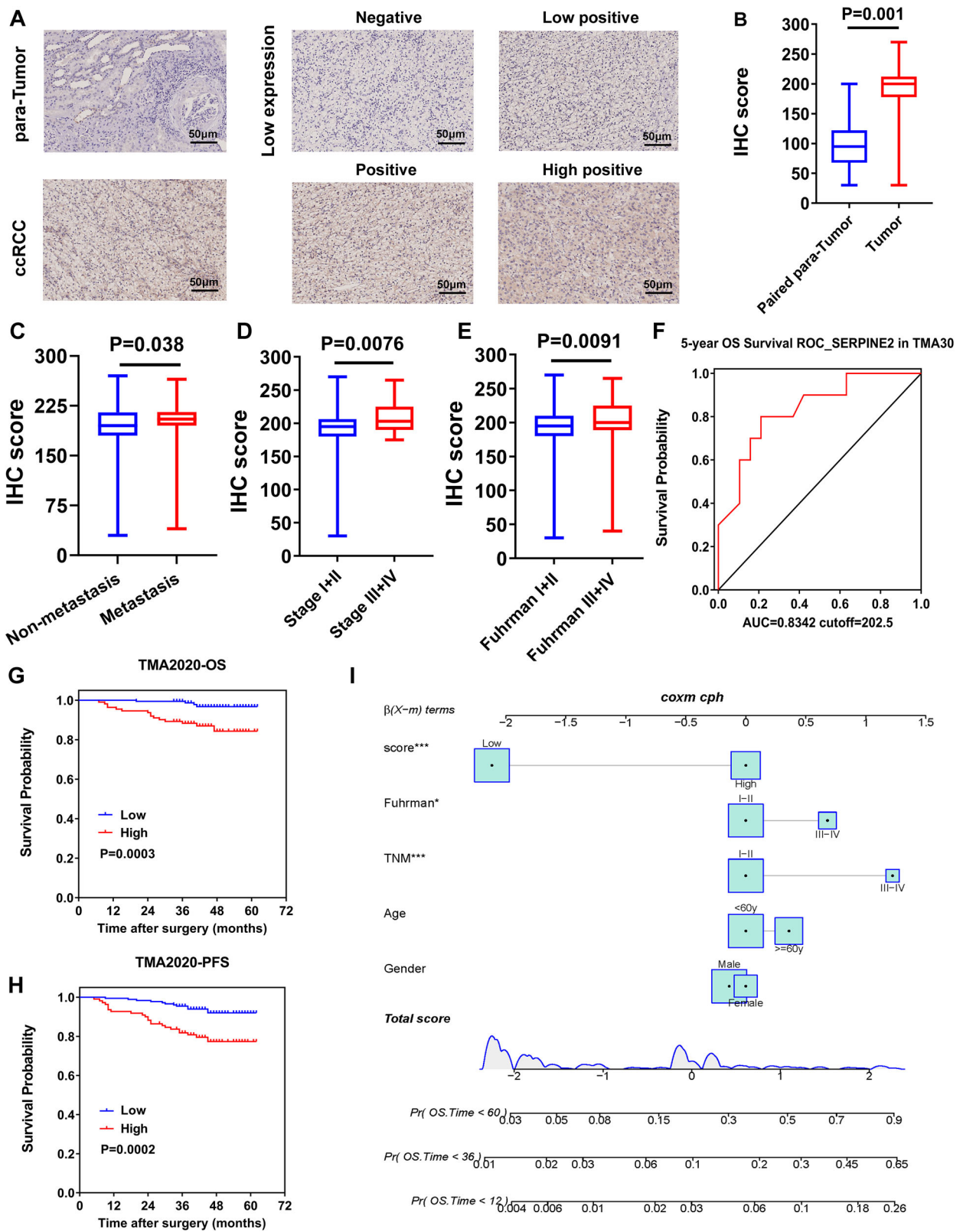
We also unfortunately found a mistake about the vertical axis in Figure 6C.

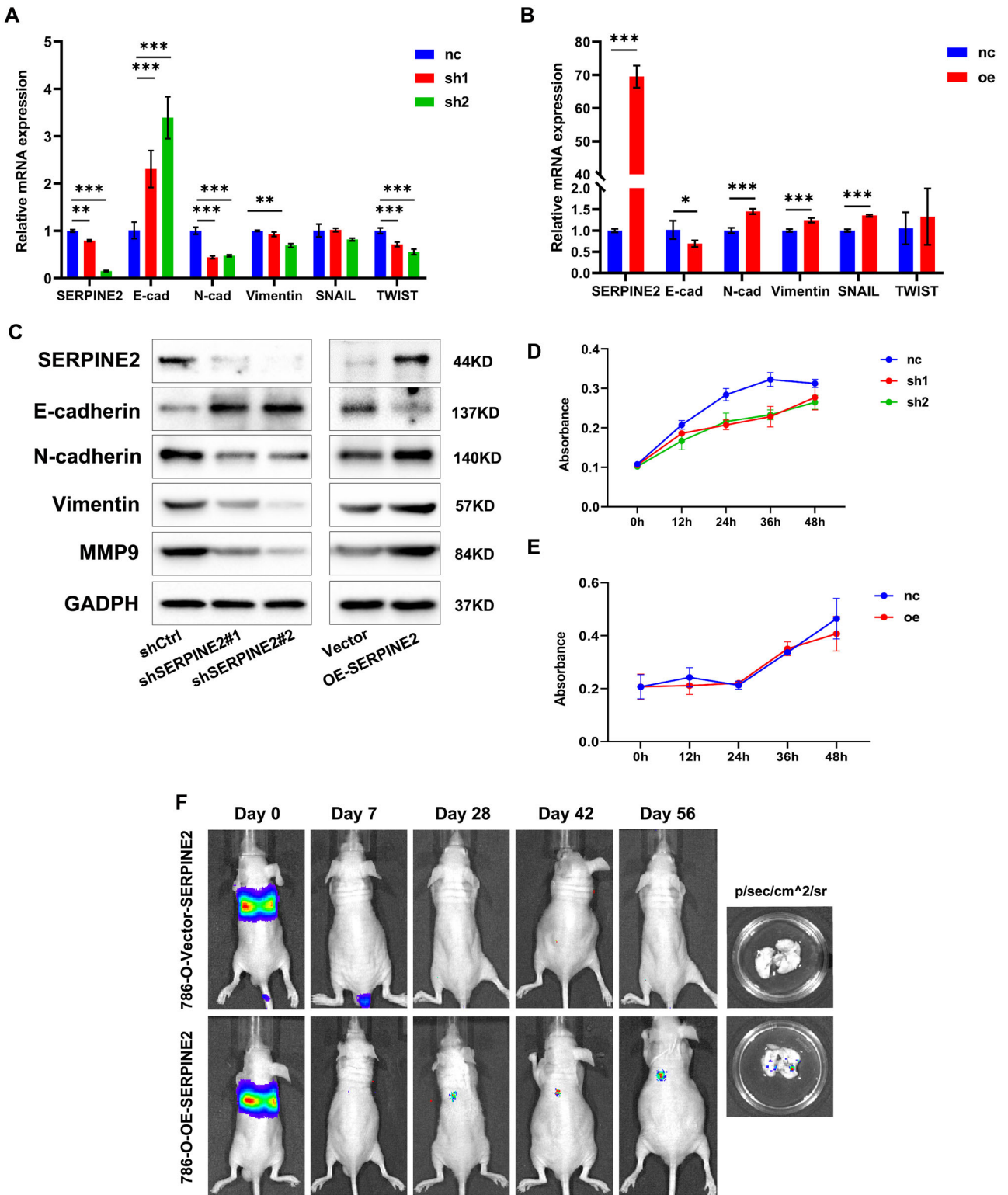
Incorrect Figure 6C



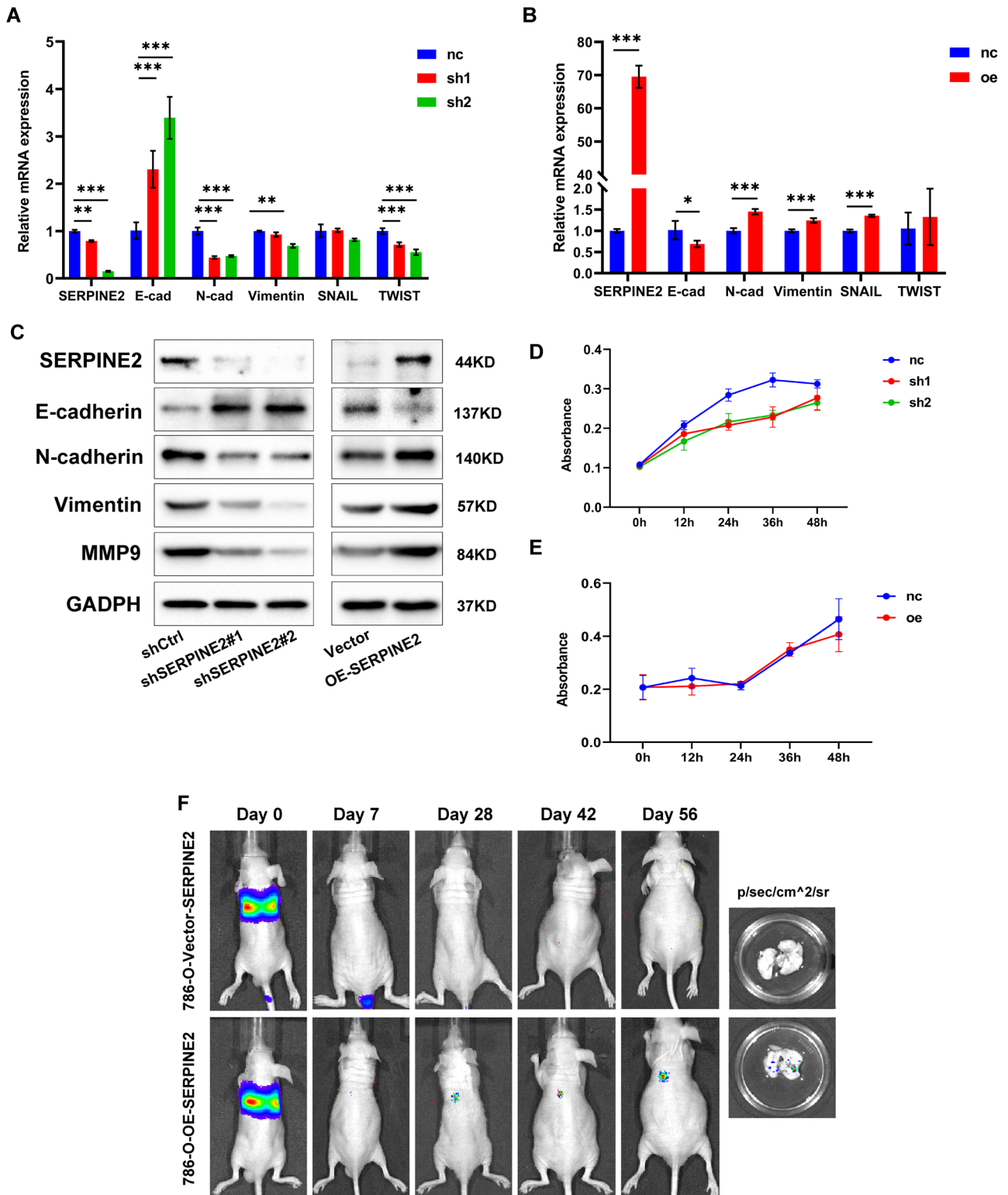
Correct Figure 6C
